



CAPE ELIZABETH LAND TRUST EDUCATION PROGRAMS

1. First Grade: Bird beak program at the CELT office in fall, hikes in the Great Pond Preserve in winter
2. Second Grade: Sorting Seeds activity at the CELT office in spring
3. Third Grade: Spring hike in Robinson Woods Preserve
4. Fourth Grade: Fall, Winter and Spring hikes in Robinson Woods Preserve
5. Fifth Grade: In-classroom CELT-run lesson on water distribution on Earth in spring
6. Chewonki Partnership: Mini-grants are available to teachers who want to incorporate environmental education into their classroom, or provide environmental education experiences for their students. One of these are the Chewonki programs, which teachers can sign up for with the mini grants, and then are held in the CELT office. These include:
 - 1st grade Owl lesson
 - 1st Grade Tide pools lesson
 - 2nd grade Biome lesson
7. Piper Shores: Adult programming three times during the year, with presentations and outings on animal tracking, tide pools and birds
8. The Landing at Cape Elizabeth: Adult programming 3-5 times a year with presentations various topics including animal tracking and tide pools.

* The 8th grade stewardship program in April, while working with students, technically falls under the stewardship umbrella.
