What is the ERC?

The ERC is a place for you to find materials and supplies that will help you do nature-related and outdoor education with your students! All items have been donated to Pond Cove by the Cape Elizabeth Land Trust.

Where is the ERC?

Currently the ERC is located in the right-hand corner of the library, next to the offices. There is a brass plaque sign next to its door.

What will I find in the ERC?

An incredible variety of educational materials. A complete inventory is included here. To give you some examples: 22 binoculars, a variety of nets, quality laminated posters about wildlife in Maine, a walrus tusk, a full deer pelt, teacher nature activity guides, copies of CELT mini-grant applications...and more! Read through the complete inventory to see all of the supplies at your educational disposal.

How do I take something out of the ERC?

The door should always be unlocked. Go in and grab the items you would like and bring them to the librarian. Most have bar codes that you can scan and check out. If there is no bar code, please leave your name, classroom number and a description of what you borrowed so that we can keep track of the items.
